

What 'remote learning' can I expect from Holy Family Catholic Primary School?

This information is to be used as a general guide and parents/carers can expect further details of remote learning for their child as and when it is required via Class Dojo. Remote learning will be set if your child is off school for 1 week or longer, due to Covid-19. We aim to implement remote learning from your child's second day of absence. There are 2 general scenarios outlined below; the first scenario where your child is not permitted to attend school and the second outlines the actions in the case of a whole bubble not being permitted to attend school.

Circumstance	Daily Remote Learning
<p>My child (<i>and their siblings if they are also attending Holy Family Catholic Primary School</i>) is absent because a member of our household is required to self-isolate. The rest of their school bubble is attending school and being taught as normal.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● 1 hour of Maths lessons uploaded to Class Dojo following on/mirroring the maths being covered in the classroom at that time. This may be a combination of White Rose maths videos (the scheme used in school), the screens shared in the classroom and resources/worksheets used in the classroom. Answers will be provided for self-marking at home. You must submit evidence that work has been completed after your child has completed the 1 hour lesson. ● 1 hour of English lessons uploaded to Class Dojo following the sequence of learning happening in the classroom. The quantity will be dependent on age/stage of your child. Some/all of these will be 'handed in' to your child's class teacher on Class Dojo for marking and on some occasions, answers will be sent for self-marking. Again, evidence of work completed must be sent to the class teacher. ● 1 hour of another subject (e.g. Science, RE, History, Geography, Art) following the lessons being covered in class that week. This may be the screens from the lesson being uploaded onto Class Dojo along with resources / worksheets (if appropriate i.e. if the resources required for the lessons are already at home). If the lessons being taught in class are not able to be delivered remotely (e.g. if it requires additional resources such as art resources e.g. clay or pastels, or geography resources e.g. maps and atlases) then alternative learning will be set on Class Dojo which may make use of the Government's 'Oak Academy' lessons or other online sites. ● Video clips: If your child's class teacher feels it beneficial, recordings may be uploaded to Class Dojo. This may be necessary in order to model/demonstrate a skill or to enable all children to access a specific resource e.g. a chapter of a book.
<p>My child's whole bubble is not permitted to attend school because they, or another member of their bubble, have tested positive for Covid-19.</p> <p>We enter another 'lockdown' with total school closure.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● 1 hour of Maths lessons uploaded to Class Dojo. This may be a combination of White Rose maths videos (the scheme used in school), the screens shared in the classroom and resources/worksheets used in the classroom. Answers will be provided for self-marking at home. You must submit evidence that work has been completed after your child has completed the 1 hour lesson. ● 1 hour of English lessons uploaded to Class Dojo. The quantity will be dependent on age/stage of your child. Some/all of these will be virtually 'handed in' to your child's class teacher on Class Dojo for marking and on some occasions, answers will be sent for self-marking. Work set may include phonics, spelling, grammar, writing and reading comprehension. Again, evidence of work completed must be sent to the class teacher. ● 1 hour of another subject (e.g. Science, History, Geography, Art): Resources, worksheets and tasks will be sent via Class Dojo. The Government's Oak Academy website along with other online sites, may also be used to support with these lessons.

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
